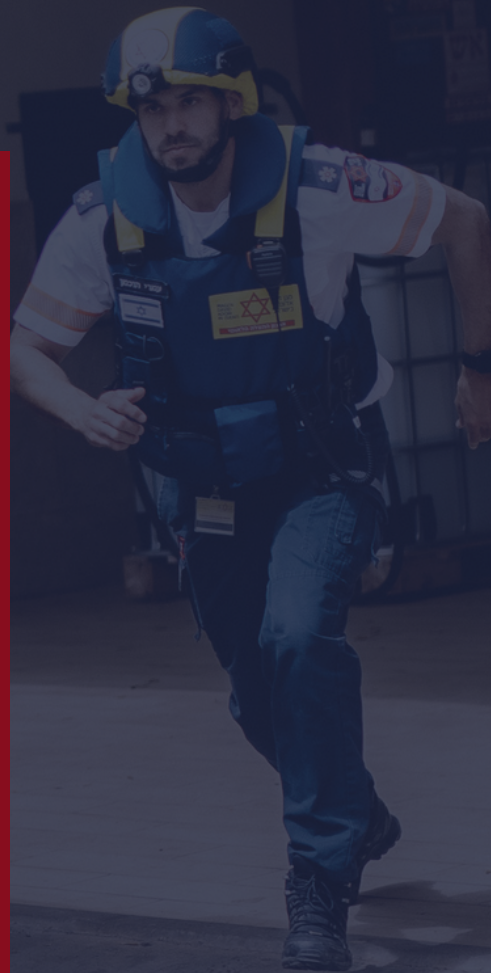

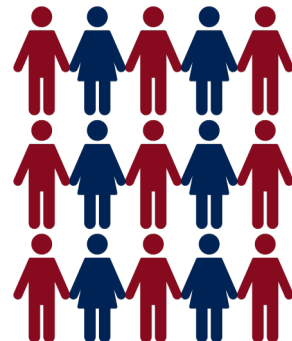

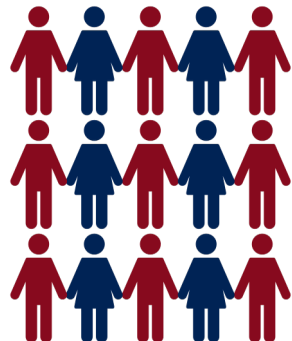

MDA IN ISRAEL

FROM VISITOR TO LIFESAVER: ARIEL'S JOURNEY WITH MDA

When Ariel first arrived in Israel, he planned to stay for a year. What he didn't expect was that the experience would reshape his future.

Working on ambulances with Magen David Adom quickly became a crash course — not only in emergency medicine, but in Hebrew and Israeli culture. Determined to learn the language, he would pretend not to speak English so his colleagues had no choice but to speak Hebrew with him.

Through the program, Ariel trained as an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) and began taking regular ambulance shifts. The work was intense, immediate, and often chaotic — far from the college campus life he had once imagined.

One call, in particular, changed everything. During a shift, he treated an 18-year-old soldier suffering from multiple gunshot wounds.

"He was shot six times," Ariel recalled. "I remember thinking, how could I go back to the States when people my age are barely surviving?"

Instead of returning home, Ariel chose to make aliyah and commit to Sherut Leumi with MDA. He continued advancing — first as an EMT and later qualifying as a paramedic.

Then came October 7.

Early that morning, Ariel received a call to head south. He packed quickly and reported for duty, beginning 16-hour shifts near border communities under chaotic and dangerous conditions. With reports that ambulances were being targeted, protective vests became essential gear.

"I wore my vest every single second," he said. "It wasn't even a question."

The experience transformed him. He became steadier under pressure, quicker to assess trauma scenes, and more confident leading others. After a particularly difficult pediatric CPR case, he decided to pursue paramedic training so he could take on greater responsibility.

Today, Ariel serves as a lead paramedic, mentoring younger volunteers not only in clinical skills, but in coping with the emotional weight of the job.

Years after what was meant to be temporary, Ariel no longer thinks about leaving.

"I don't think there's a better place to be Jewish than in Israel," he said.

Despite the challenges — the bureaucracy, the language, the intensity of the work — he feels fully at home.

"No one really cares where you're from," he said. "You're just family."

His one lingering struggle?

"Israeli grammar doesn't make sense," he added with a grin. "It just doesn't."



A FAMILY THAT ANSWERS THE CALL — TOGETHER



When people say "it stays in the family," they usually mean shared values or loyalty. For the Farkash family it means something even more powerful: responding to medical emergencies side by side.

Seven siblings — Avraham (41), Rivki, Shlomi, Meir, Leah, David and Elisha (19) — all volunteer as medics with Magen David Adom in the Jerusalem region. Leah's husband, Elazar, is also a volunteer, making lifesaving service a true family mission that spans generations.

"The first were Avraham, Shlomi and Meir, who have been volunteering for many years," Leah shared. "In recent years the rest of us joined, each at a different time, without coordinating. It turns out we all caught the volunteering bug."

A Built-In Support Network

With eight family members on call, support is never far away.

Avraham, the eldest, says their commitment to service reflects how they were raised.

With so many Farkash medics on duty, it's not unusual for siblings to find themselves at the same scene.

Shlomi remembers one of his first calls as a newly certified medic nearly 15 years ago, when he and Avraham responded together to a serious accident.

"It was the most complex event I had encountered at that point," he recalled. "Avraham was professional, and I learned a lot from him during that case."

Service and Family Life

For Leah and Elazar, balancing volunteering with raising children requires coordination. They usually take separate shifts, though they once managed to volunteer together while a grandmother watched the kids.

"God willing, when the children grow up, we'll do many more shifts together — and maybe even with them when they become volunteers," Leah said.

"The fact that we both volunteer makes it much easier," he said. "We understand the importance, even at times when it's less convenient for the family."

For Leah, the meaning behind their service is simple.

"There is nothing more moving and amazing than saving lives — especially when it happens alongside your brothers and sisters, who share the same desire to spread goodness."

For the Farkash family, saving lives isn't just something they do. It's who they are — together.

FROM ARMCHAIR ZIONIST TO VOLUNTEER: A CANADIAN SURGEON'S CALL TO ISRAEL



Throughout my life, I have carried many identities: son, surgeon, husband, father, grandfather, Canadian, Jew, atheist, and Zionist. But after the events of October 7, 2023, my identity as a Zionist moved to the forefront.

I believe the Jewish people are a nation with the inherent right to a sovereign state of their own — Israel, a small country in the Middle East, only 15 to 20 kilometers wide at its narrowest point. For most of my life, I was what I would call an armchair Zionist. I held the belief quietly and privately, rarely discussing it openly.

October 7th changed that. Confronted with the brutality of that day, I realized that remaining a passive supporter no longer felt true to who I was. When friends asked why I was going to Israel, my answer was simple: I am a Zionist, and I stand with Israel.

On March 15, 2024, I went to Israel as a volunteer eventually spending 4 weeks on an IDF base and 4 weeks working as a physician on MDF ambulances. I returned in 2025 for another 4 weeks. I documented my adventure in my blog, gobriantravel.com followed by the soon to be published book entitled, *Swords of Iron, Israel at War, a Canadian Surgeon's Perspective*.

This book is dedicated to the volunteer physicians who travelled to Israel during the Swords of Iron War and served on Magen David Ambulances. All proceeds from the sale of this book will go directly to MDA for the purchase of an ambulance.

YOUNG ADULTS

As the next generation, it is both our responsibility and privilege to support the lifesaving work of Magen David Adom.

Like many, we once thought MDA was simply Israel's ambulance service. We soon learned it is far more — Israel's national emergency medical, disaster response, ambulance, and blood services organization, responding to crises at home and around the world. Despite its national role, MDA relies heavily on the generosity of Diaspora donors through its global network of Friend Societies.

Inspired by this, we stepped forward as Chairs of the Montreal Magen David Adom Young Adults division to raise awareness and critical funds for the heroes in Israel who save lives every day. By uniting our community to fund an ambulance, we can make a tangible impact and strengthen MDA's lifesaving capacity.

This is our opportunity to honor our heritage, stand with Israel, and help build a safer future for generations to come.

LEARNING FROM THE FRONT LINES: REFLECTIONS ON THE MAGEN DAVID ADOM INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL RESPONSE SEMINAR

In December 2025 Magen David Adom (MDA) hosted the 10th International Medical Response Seminar in Tel Aviv. We joined twenty-eight physicians, paramedics, nurses, and other healthcare professionals from eight countries for 5 days of intense learning. Lectures from experts in prehospital medicine, population resilience, blood and human milk banking and disaster response were complemented by mass casualty exercises. Tours of the MDA Ramle dispatch center and meeting with trauma team physicians at Shaare Tzedek Hospital facilitated understanding of the Israel emergency medical system. Spending a day in an ambulance gave a taste of the day-to-day efforts of MDA serving the public.

We visited with MDA staff and residents of Sderot, Kibbutzim Ofakim and Be'eri who graciously shared their experiences and showed us firsthand the carnage and horrors committed on October 7th. We paid respect at the Nova Festival site and learned of countless acts of bravery. The recounting of personal stories and the response from that day under unimaginable stress was humbling. We met with heroes. Attending the MDA seminar as healthcare practitioners with interests in emergency medicine and prehospital systems as well as long-time supporters and previous volunteers, was an opportunity not to miss. The unfortunate reality is that MDA has extensive experience in dealing with trauma and mass casualty incidents. The ability to adapt and learn from events and then share their learnings allows us to examine and potentially improve our local systems. The adoption of protocols and technology by MDA is second to none. Yet what is more impressive is the engagement of community and the population to enhance response to all emergencies and lead to a more prepared and resilient nation. Invariably in any conversation with a member of MDA staff or volunteer, the love of vocation was evident. As part of Klal Yisrael we take pride in such a dynamic organization that unites Israeli society but also shares expertise responding to disasters globally. Training individuals and communities with programs such as the First 7 Minutes builds stronger societies. MDA can bring people together regardless of faith or nationality. There is something that tugs at your heart when you wear the white shirt and hoodie with the Red Star of David on the back and sing Hatikvah at the site of the Nova Music festival or at the Kotel with your new friends and colleagues. We are in this together. Am Yisrael Chai!
